



Spotty sock jars



You know how there's always an odd sock at the end of the wash? Well we have the answer! Collect up your random socks that have lost their partners and turn them into a woollen warmer for jars around the house.

MATERIALS

- Odd or unwanted old socks
- Different-sized jars, washed and labels removed
- Fabric glue

EQUIPMENT

- Fabric scissors
- Small paintbrush
- Binder clips

▼ **STEP THREE** Paint some fabric glue around the rim of the jar, then press the cuff of the sock firmly against the glass. Use binder clips to keep it in position and leave it to dry.

TOP TIP
These sock coverings work especially well as vases, pencil pots and paintbrush holders. Use them to jazz up your desk at work, or add a touch of homemade charm to your mantelpiece.



▼ **STEP ONE** Cut one of your unwanted socks in half with a pair of scissors.



▼ **STEP FOUR** When the glue is completely dry, pull the sock tightly over the base of the jar, cut away any excess sock and glue the sock to the base of the jar.

▼ **STEP FIVE** Your spotty jar is now ready for use around the home.

▼ **STEP TWO** Slip the top portion of the sock over the jar to fit snugly, keeping the cuff of the sock uppermost.
