# Colouring-In Chair

Personalise a plain furniture piece by colouring it in using the Sharpie™ permanent markers.

### materials:

- Plastic chair
- Sharpie permanent markers
- Clean cloth and paint remover
- Bucket of soapy water with sponge

### instructions:

- 1 Wet the clean cloth lightly with paint remover and remove any stains or marks on the plastic chair.
- 2 Use the soapy water and sponge to wash the chair thoroughly, ensuring that you remove all the paint remover. Allow to dry.
- 3 Using the black marker, draw a pattern freehand. Allow to dry overnight.

4 When the black pattern is completely dry, start to colour it in between the black lines. Do not extend over the black lines, to prevent the colours from blurring. When colouring ensure that you use the whole surface of the tip. This way you will be applying more dye to the plastic surface. Also, use the side of the tip when blending.

5 Continue doing this until the entire pattern is coloured in. CH

#### TIP:

Leave the chair to dry overnight once you've finished colouring. Seal the chair with a clear lacquer or varnish. This gives additional protection and longevity to the project and removes any risk of some residual colour coming off on clothes.
