

## materials:

- Leftover border wallpaper, thin scrapbook paper or pictures copied onto card
- Round lampshade with straight sides (resembling a drum, this one has a diameter of 20cm)
- Ruler
- Pencil
- Guillotine (for ease and efficiency, but not essential)
- Paper glue
- Glue gun

## instructions:

**1** Cut the paper into rectangles with a height measured exactly to match the height of the lampshade, and a width of 16cm.

**2** With the rectangle face down, draw a line 1cm from the edge down each vertical side.

**3** Fold each rectangle inwards along those lines and glue them together to form a flat edge cylinder.

Border wallpaper is less messy as you simply need to peel and stick.

**4** Arrange the paper cylinders around the lampshade and ensure that there are no wide gaps between any of the cylinders.

**5** When you are satisfied with the positioning of the cylinders, use a glue gun to paste the flat edge cylinders to the outside of the lampshade until it is entirely covered. **CH**

### TIP:

Cover the entire lampshade with a matt spray varnish. This will make dusting easier and protect the paper.
