



Cone Wreath

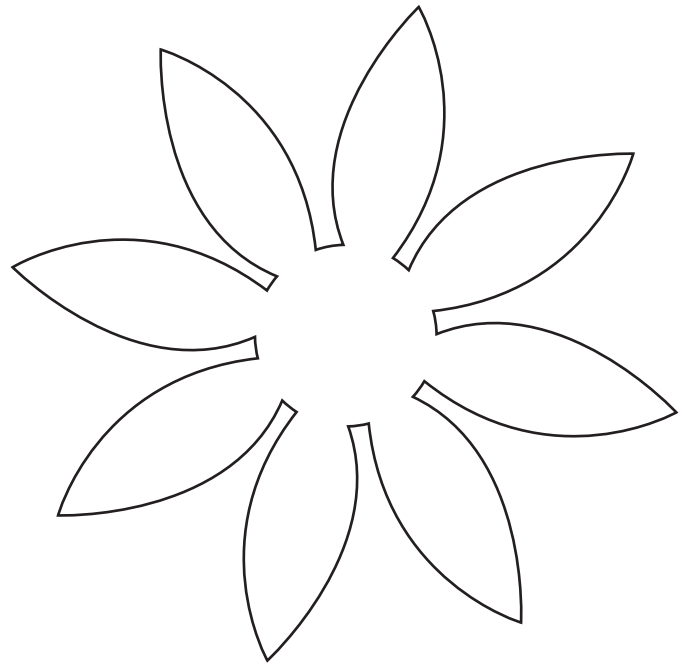
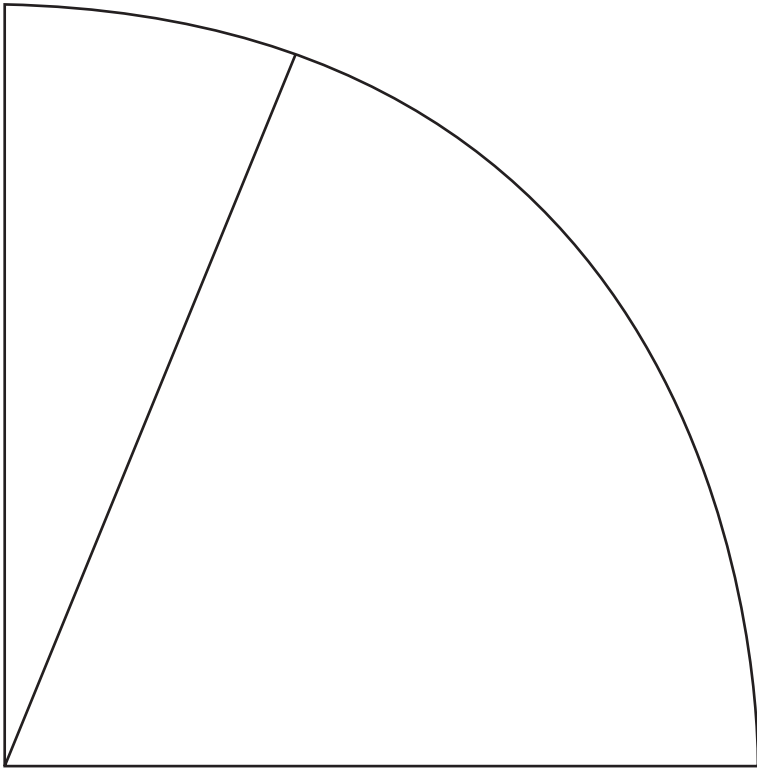
You will need:

- Template on page 2
- Round polystyrene canvas
- Paper glue
- Cardboard sheets
- (Curious Metal Red Lacquer and Curious Metal White Silver were used from the RBE paper range)
- Pencil
- Ruler
- Double-sided tape
- Paper scissors



How to make a cone wreath:

1. Measure the radius of the polystyrene canvas. This will determine the length of your cones.
2. On a flat surface, trace the template onto paper. Use a pair of scissors to cut out around the outside trace lines.
3. As indicated on the template, use a ruler to draw a line from the indicated mark to the pointed corner. This is where the fold must be.
4. Put double-sided tape along the full length of the drawn line.
5. Twist the adjacent edge towards and past the tape strip and tighten as needed. Join the forming cone shape. Continue this process for all the other cut-out paper pieces.
6. The polystyrene canvas that I used had a circumference of about 20cm. I made approximately fifteen cones, which were about 15cm in height to cover the canvas.
7. Glue the cones onto the canvas using paper glue.
8. To round off your wreath, place a cut-out flower in the middle for a neat look.
